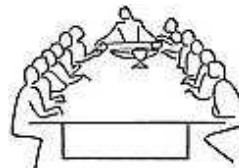

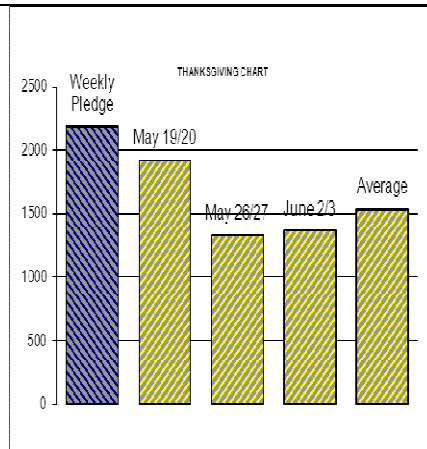

## **Feast Days of the Coming**

### **Week**

#### **Mon Jun 11 St Barnabas Apostle**

We meet St Barnabas in Acts 4:36-37: 'There was a Levite of Cypriot origin called Joseph whom the apostles surnamed Barnabas.' He was probably converted shortly after Pentecost and while not one of the Twelve, he is regarded like St Paul as an 'apostle' Founder of the church in Antioch, Barnabas accompanied first Paul and then Mark on taking the Gospel to the Gentiles.

#### **Wed Jun 13 St Anthony of Padua 1195 - 1231**

One of the most loved saints, Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal, to a wealthy family and was named Ferdinand Martins de

Bulhões. First a member of the Augustinian Order, he joined the Franciscans when he was 26 years old. He died in Padua, Italy, at the age of 36 and was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

## **Fri June 15 Feast of the Sacred Heart**

(First celebrated in 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes.)

'The life story of Jesus as found in the Gospels is a story of a heart full of sympathy. -"And seeing the multitudes, he had compassion on them because they were distressed and lying like sheep that have no shepherd" (Matt.) No wonder people listened when he invited them -"Come to me all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest".' Geraldton Diocese

(In 1944 Pope Pius XII extended the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary to the Universal Church.)
