From Debbie's Desk

An exercise I love to do with our Confirmation candidates is to ask them to think of someone who really inspires them.

This could be someone who is living today, someone who holds a special place in their hearts, or even someone who may be from history. It is interesting to hear who they choose as a role model. Very often, they choose their mum, their dad, their grandfather or their grandmother. I then ask them to choose one of the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit that they believe this special person really makes good use of. Invariably, the life of this inspirational person really does allow the Holy Spirit's Gifts to shine through their everyday life. Have you ever considered how these Gifts help you out in your own life? I often pray that God will help me to make good use of the Gifts that I know were showered upon me at my own Confirmation. When I am faced with a situation that frightens or confuses me, or that threatens to overwhelm me, a quick glance towards the Holy Spirit allows me to tap into those wonderful assets. Maybe the Holy Spirit receives a little less attention in our prayers than does the Father, and Jesus, the Son. Jesus is real to us, he is someone we can easily turn to in prayer, because he is predictable and recognisable. We know so much about him, and we know that he lived his own human journey as we live ours. We follow his example of praying to Our Father. Jesus taught us to do this, and even gave us the words of The Lord's Prayer. Yet he also promised to send the Holy Spirit, to guide us and to guard us when he returned to his Father. He rose into the sky in front of his friends, and was then taken from their sight, to show them in no uncertain terms that his appearances to them were changing. They would no longer see him in the same way. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are one God. The Holy Spirit is with us in every living moment, the promise of Jesus. The Apostles came to realise this at Pentecost. In Confirmation we encounter the Holy Spirit personally, and we are lavished with Gifts that will allow us to become inspirational people, sent out to touch others. Can you recognise these Gifts in yourself? In honestly identifying and accepting these Gifts in ourselves, we give praise and thanks to God. We recognise that we are not self-sufficient, but that we are constantly supported and nourished by the God of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In thinking this through, maybe a quick word to the Holy Spirit for Knowledge, Understanding, Wisdom might be in order? It is certainly a thought that is bigger than my brain without a whole lot of help! Something to work through this week...
