### From Debbie's Desk

Next Tuesday evening, June 14<sup>th</sup>, at 7 pm, our Parish will celebrate the Feast of St Anthony of Padua with Mass, and the blessing of St Anthony's bread. This special feast day is especially important to our Italian parishioners, who bring along a huge basket of bread rolls each year, carrying on a tradition that reaches back to the 13<sup>th</sup> century. At the end of Mass, Fr Arsenio will bless the bread and it will be distributed to those who wish to take some. St Anthony's bread is blessed and distributed, especially to the poor, as a means of thanking God for favours granted through the intercession of St Anthony. A beautiful traditional statue of St Anthony stands in our church, to the right of the altar. He is known as the Patron Saint of lost things. A quick word to St Anthony, asking him to pray for us when we have lost something significant usually produces amazing results. He is, after all, in the direct presence of God, who is just waiting to be asked for favours through St Anthony's intercession. St Anthony prays for us and for the things we ask him to bring to God on our behalf, giving glory to God for his goodness to us, and to his mercy and love. St Anthony's statue shows him holding a lily, symbolising purity, and the Child Jesus, who stands on the scriptures, which St Anthony holds in his left hand. If you look closely, Jesus' little foot is actually emerging from the scriptures. We refer to Jesus as 'the Word', 'God's Word, made flesh'. St Anthony was known as a brilliant preacher, inspired by the Holy Spirit to bring God's Word to all who would listen. It is comforting to know that St Anthony prays for us before God, and we thank God especially through this Feast for the favours he grants through St Anthony's prayers for us, a great blessing indeed
