### **Jubilee Year of Mercy**

#### **Corporal Work of Mercy: Give Drink to the Thirsty**

Water is an amazing gift from God. Within nature we see that water is both gentle and powerful, life-giving and yet also phenomenally destructive. The physical power of water is reflected in the Church's use of water as a powerful spiritual symbol: water is for washing, purifying, and new birth. It is the symbol of Baptism and is therefore part of sacramental action, that is, the action of God that offers new life and propels us in mission. The Holy Spirit is given to us like water in Confirmation; washing, breaking down barriers and rejuvenating.

Pope Francis illustrates how water is part of an *ecosystem of mercy*: "the entire material universe speaks of God's love, God's boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." History shows that we usually ignore the quality of gift in this ecosystem and simply take what we want, or we reject it and seek satisfaction elsewhere. The result is thirst: a persistent drying of the soul that seeks relief. "The LORD leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul" (Ps 23).

We are all thirsty for the grace of God. When we recognise the thirst in ourselves we can recognise it in others and, with the grace of God and the Holy Spirit in our hearts, offer the only drink that satisfies:  
"But whoever drinks of the water that I will give will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give will become a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:14).
