### **From Debbie's Desk**

The Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady into heaven on 15<sup>th</sup> August is one of the many highlights of the Church's year. This emphasis on devotion to Jesus' mother, and our mother, shows us how important Mary is to those who hold the Catholic Faith. We wonder at images of Mary crowned as Queen of Heaven, standing amongst the clouds, wearing a coronet of stars. This artistic representation hints to us of the glorious reward that God has lavished upon Mary in eternity. Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we are drawn to honour her, and to entrust our prayers to her, prayers that she carries to her son Jesus. And how Jesus loves to please his mum! But we should never lose sight of the fact that the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, are a real family that we can relate to. They have lived our earthly journey before us. Mary truly understands the pressures of being a loving daughter, and the responsibilities that she chose to accept as a wife and a mother. Mary, Joseph and Jesus were refugees. Mary watched her only son die after being tried, sentenced and tortured. She was also a grieving widow, we know that Joseph would never have left her side, or Jesus' side, except through death. Mary knows the heights of human joy and the depths of human terror and horror, and the worry that comes with motherhood. Parents goggle at the huge task of accepting responsibility for each new baby, knowing that they are the ones who must provide for every mental, emotional and physical need of their precious child. Mary knew who Jesus is, right from the moment of his conception. Imagine being responsible for caring for the Saviour of the World, God's Son! Talk about pressure! Mary is our role model. We admire her communion with God, her devotion to her Son, her openness to the power of the Holy Spirit and her rock solid trust in the Father's love. We know that she prays for us constantly. There is nothing that we face that she does not understand. May we rely on Mary's faithful presence with each of us in our day, and may we also share her heavenly joy at the end of our earthly journey.

#### Jubilee Year of Mercy Corporal Work of Mercy: Clothe the Naked

The thought of being naked - while not it itself a bad thing! - brings up feelings of being exposed and vulnerable. Clothing does so much more than keeping us warm; through it we reveal our identity (consider a school uniform, cultural dress, work outfit, sports uniform).

It is good to clothe our spirits too: "Whilst garments clothe the nakedness of our bodies, we often also need comfort and counsel to clothe our naked spirits" (Sisters of Mercy). Friendship is a key concept that the Sisters of Mercy are using to reflect upon this Jubilee Year. Do you feel warmer after talking to a dear friend?

Saint Paul reminds us that as Christians we "put on Christ" (Rom 13:14). The vulnerability and nakedness of baptism (yes it was a clothes-free occasion in the early Church!) is enveloped and held by God's grace. We receive our spiritual warmth from the love of God. Sharing this love is called mercy:

"A little mercy makes the world less cold and more just" (Pope Francis).
