From Debbie's Desk

Twice a year, in about March and October, anyone and everyone from our parish is invited to the Anointing Mass, and the lunch that follows. We are blessed to be able to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, no matter how old we are, or what our state of health may be. 'The movies' traditionally depict a mad scramble to call a Priest to the bedside of a character who is approaching death, and in days gone by the Sacrament was called 'the Last Rites' for just that reason. It was usually a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to receive the Sacrament, usually reserved for someone who was in danger of death, and most people, if they were lucky to receive it at all, may have received it only when they were on their deathbed. The mental effects of seeing the Priest by the bed must have been extraordinary! The one being anointed, and those nearby, were well and truly convinced that the last breath was just around the corner, and for that reason alone, many people delayed calling the priest as they could not cope with the possibility of losing their loved one. Many missed out on receiving the amazing graces that flow from this healing Sacrament, or were too mentally stressed to appreciate its power. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is freely available for anyone who may need any sort of healing or help to cope with the challenges of life, be they physical, mental or even spiritual, and you may receive this Sacrament over and over during your lifetime. Those fortunate enough to have received the Sacrament, or those who have been present when a loved one has received it, often report extraordinary effects, which may be physically noticeable to those present. Peace seems to be one of the most obvious effects, a peace that 'the world' may find incongruous or incomprehensible, but a peace that makes a huge difference to the one who receives it, and even to the one who notices it. The effects we cannot see may

be even more dramatic. If you know anyone who would like to receive this miraculous Sacrament at any time, please encourage them to contact parish staff in order to organise an appointment with Fr Arsenio or Fr John.

Pope Francis' Prayer for the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved. Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit forever and ever. Amen.

Spiritual Work of Mercy:

Jubilee Year of Mercy
As the Jubilee Year of Mercy draws to a close Pope Francis has reflected on the "strangers" in our midst. The Pope insists that a Christian must never have a closed heart - we must pray to have open hearts. He shares an anecdote with us of an elderly woman who helped an immigrant. As the lady came across this young man, who was without shoes, they began to speak and she asked him, "What are you searching for?" "Saint Peter's to go through the Holy Door," he responded to her question. Moved with sympathy, she thought to herself: *But how can he walk? He doesn't even have shoes.* She insisted on offering a taxi to bring

him. When the taxi driver stopped, however, he was hesitant to accept the passenger as he smelled very badly. Eventually the driver agreed and the immigrant and the lady got in and chatted on the way to the Vatican. They spoke about his history, what he has lived through, the trials, the war, etc. By the end of the ride, the lady went to pay, and the driver, who hesitated to accept them, said: "No, Signora. It is I who must pay for you, because you made me listen to a story that changed my heart."
