From Debbie's Desk

As I mentioned last week, at the start of November we celebrate two very big moments in the Church year, All Saints Day and All Souls Day, a chance to remember all of those who have died throughout time. In preparation for writing this article, I went to the scriptures for inspiration, as our family history seems a good place to start when thinking about where we are headed. We look 'behind', to imagine our future. I was surprised to learn that there are heaps of readings that are available to be chosen by the Priest, especially for All Souls Day. Apart from the Gospels, which tell us directly about Jesus' adventures, the suggested readings come from the Acts of the Apostles, the writings of Jesus' friends in the time after his resurrection and ascension to the Father. This made me think. Jesus lived in mucky circumstances, in the company of lepers, prostitutes, priests, lawyers, politicians, widows, tax collectors, beggars and average, every day guys in the street. It was through his experiences with the unglamorous aspects of daily living that he was able to clearly reveal to us the wonders that we will all encounter at the end of our journey home to God, heaven. Following Jesus' return to the Father, his friends were in constant danger and discomfort, living off donations, hunted and persecuted, travelling dangerous paths by boat or on foot, sticking their necks out daily to spread his message throughout the world. These are the ones who wrote the Acts of the Apostles. Despite their difficulties, they were clearly able to speak volumes to us of the glory of heaven. Watching their friends being torn to bits by wild animals could not have been an encouraging experience, yet they all 'kept on keeping on'. They never took their eyes off the ball, life in God's presence for eternity. They wrote from the trenches for those in the trenches. In their physical hardship, these brave missionaries found the glory of heaven. They found hope in death. They found courage in fear. They wrote about what has been, what is, and what will be, including the moment of meeting God face to face, the moment of passing through the door of death. They wrote of this glorious hope, despite the rubble around them. We are no different. It is good to be reminded that through our own experiences, from the joyful and the peaceful to the simply horrendous, we too can come to know, without doubt, that in the moment of closing our eyes on life and opening them in death, we too will gaze upon the face of Jesus. We too have the option of meeting Jesus as our companion, not as a stranger, but as our friend, through knowing him in this very moment, now. Like the friends he lived with in Judea, we too walk with Jesus, and eat with Jesus, and we too come to the moment of meeting God in our death as his disciple from the trenches, one of those beloved friends to whom he has entrusted his message, with the mission

to bring others to know him too. God is with us now, in all that we do, and it is through today that we find tomorrow. We too live in hope, with the intention of taking the place that Jesus has prepared for us, in the company of the Saints in heaven, reunited with those we have loved, who have gone before us. My eternal life started at the moment I began, is now, and continues forever... Hmm.
