From Debbie's Desk

Our parish prayer list is a powerful tool for getting things done, and every day many good people actively pray for those who are named in our newsletter each week, and it is something each of us can do for others with very little time or effort. It is good to be reminded that, as we pray for those who cross our paths in life, our prayers join with those of many, many good people who spend quiet time with the Lord, and include us in their prayers, unknown to us, but faithful in their support. Even those in nursing homes, or those who do not get out much now for a multiple of reasons, can undertake the powerful task of supporting others who are burdened with ill health, grief or any number of other challenges. Knowing that we are part of a chain of conversations with God when we feel most alone can really bring comfort and peace in a dark moment. I am aware that someone is praying for me, as I am still able to do what I do, which brings me courage when I need it.

But I am also aware that God knows exactly who each and every one of us is, and what we need, and he is 'on it' before someone even asks. Prayer fascinates me, in its potential, in its simplicity, and in its effects. We pray for things when we need them, usually resorting to prayer when we get a bit desperate and have run out of a sense of control of our own destiny, or when we are so confronted by the messiness of the lives of those around us that we are too uncomfortable to simply do nothing. Prayer can often be the only active option we have. If I stop and think, right now I am drawing God's attention to individuals who are dying, and little ones still to be born. I know, or know of couples celebrating their engagement, families who are shattered through grief of all shapes and sizes, someone who is in jail, someone else who should be, a birthday girl, and a birthday boy, students studying towards a bright future, and those who have no concept of where tomorrow is likely to take them. I have beautiful friends who inspire me through their tenacity and love of life. I know those who are enduring life-changing illness, those looking for jobs, happy little kids excitedly looking forward to school holiday 'different', people struggling to find a roof over their heads on these cold

nights, and many, many average everyday plodders who have just conquered the water bill, and are now working on the power bill... I could go on and on. All around me, and all around you, ordinary people living ordinary lives need prayers, as we all do, asking God's 'invisible' help to tackle our next breath, and consequently, our next adventure. Whether that next breath is our first or our last, you could say that each of us is alone, and yet each of us is never alone, immersed in God's awareness and love. We ask for something we need, we thank him for his gifts, we ask for forgiveness, and we pray when we are bursting with appreciation for our beautiful world. God already knows our thoughts before we form them. Our prayer is conversation with God, we grow in his friendship, and those we bring to him also 'grow', in ways we may not ever recognise. As usual, I have been thinking... Mary prayed for Jesus, God the Son. He still needed his mother's prayers, in his human frailty. Her prayers were addressed to God, for Jesus. Hmm. Another big concept for a quiet moment of reflection... Who needs your prayers today?

Over the past 4 weeks we have had twelve different guests stay with us filling 149 beds between them. Our third week was busy and we hosted 9 guests on two consecutive nights. This week has been a little more relaxed, with a maximum of 6 at night.

We've had no serious incidents, and for that we are thankful. The current guests have all stayed a number of nights and know us and each other quite well now. They are visibly looking healthier and more relaxed.
