From Debbie's Desk

This week the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our church is full of images that help us to contemplate who Jesus is. The statues, paintings, and stained-glass windows are our human attempt to express God, who is, of course, invisible and beyond our direct sight during our earthly journeys. These artist's impressions of Jesus, and through him, God, fill in the wide picture for each of us through someone else's eyes, and we constantly add finishing touches for ourselves through our own experiences, a life-long project of growth. The large statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in our church is placed right next to the lectern, where the Word of God is proclaimed for us at each Mass. We receive Jesus from the chalice right in front of this statue. It is an image of Jesus that is commonly found in traditional churches all around the world. His exposed heart is surrounded by a crown of thorns and burning with love for each of us, no matter who we are. The wounds in Jesus' hands are clearly visible, they are highlighted, not hidden. One of Jesus' hands is held in the traditional pose of 3 fingers held forward, and two back, which speaks of his nature as God the Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The expression in his eyes as captured by the artist is one of loving compassion and mercy, not of judgement or anger. If we pause to take in these details, we are reminded that Jesus is a friend who cares for each of us as we negotiate each day, with all of its trials and joys. He knows about being cold, hungry, betrayed, beaten up, wrongly accused, a refugee, alone. His crown of kingship in this image is not of gold, but of thorns wound round his heart. He knows our struggles, and understands, because he has lived as we live, a human person, just as we are human. This Solemnity is linked with the Society of St Vincent de Paul's work with the vulnerable, who often rely on others for the basics to cope with daily challenges. The image inspires us to recognise that Jesus cares, and calls us to care in our turn. The outreach of Vinnies is practical and so necessary, and the few dollars we may be able to donate to assist them in their work helps immensely. Thank you for your generosity. Our school's mini-Vinnies and Social

Justice representatives have been working to help raise awareness in the minds of our children that there are families in our own neighbourhood who find winter-time hard to cope with financially. The valuable work of the Winter Night Shelter project, Stable One is another expression of our Parish's practical care for others. We gather as a Parish to worship God in each Mass, and we are 'sent out' to live as Jesus lived, reminded to be as Jesus is to others. We continue to worship God by ministering to those we encounter, inspired by the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to look outwards to others with eyes of mercy and compassion, and to love with his Sacred Heart. This week, we may be the strong ones, who have the resources and strength to reach out to someone else. Equally, next week, we may be the ones in desperate need of compassion and mercy from someone else, vulnerable and fragile. Feeling at our lowest ebb, disheartened and in need of hope, a friendly smile and some practical assistance from one who cares provides dignity and warmth, basic human rights. A kind heart brings much to the one who receives, but also brings much to the generous giver. That statue says an awful lot!

Veranda Repair works
After completing paperwork requirements of Local Council, the presbytery veranda will undergo major repair works commencing 11th June. Access to the rooms underneath the presbytery will not be available for 4 weeks. For those who will have transactions in the office, access will be at the back door.

We Care – Responding to the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act.

From the earliest times, Christ's followers have set themselves apart by their care of the vulnerable (Acts 4:34). On 19 June 2019, the *Voluntary Assisted Dying Act* (VAD) comes into effect. It legalises euthanasia and assisted suicide. Despite what the law may say, our Christian tradition affirms that every life, including those of the sick and suffering, is sacred. Euthanasia and assisted suicide are never part of end of life care. Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a "throw-away culture." We are called to follow Christ by accompanying people with compassion, sharing hope not fear.

The Bishops of the Catholic dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst, echoing Pope Francis, have published a pastoral letter including practical guidance on ways we can be conscientious objectors to euthanasia.
